ALBERTA CURRICULUM

Redwater School follows the Alberta Curriculum, which specifies the knowledge and skills that students are expected to learn, set by Alberta Education.

ATHLETICS

Redwater School offers a wide variety of opportunities for students to learn active, healthy lifestyles. Physical education, sports and clubs help students build skills, friendships, teamwork, confidence, discipline and perseverance. Students in grades 6 to 9 participate in interschool league play. The Green Certificate Program is operated by Alberta Agriculture, Food & Rural Development in partnership with the farming industry. Through apprenticeship style training, our students gain competence in career skills in any of the following production areas: cow-calf, field crop, dairy, feedlot beef, sheep, irrigated field crop and swine.

REGISTERED APPRENTICESHIP PROGRAM

RAP allows high school students to earn credit toward a high school diploma and an apprenticeship program at the same time. Students can select from more than 50 trades and occupations to explore. Each student is paired with an employer, providing invaluable experience and training and a distinct post-graduation advantage.



LOGOS/LOGOS CONNECT

LOGOS is a non-denominational Christian-based program offered to our K-9 students. The program offers an excellent academic education enhanced by daily activities (prayer, scripture reading, praise), periodic chapel times and assemblies that build faith and fellowship. LOGOS Connect acts as an extension for high school students, a class offering that provides the framework for Alberta high school credits and the chance to connect and grow in their Christian faith.
